In the Gardens...

New Native Azalea Garden

Our beloved native Rhododendron can be found on the top of rocky hillsides, upland forests, along streams, and even in swamps. Their beautiful flowers light up the landscape in late spring, and many are also fragrant, attracting pollinators such as bumblebees, butterflies, and hummingbirds. Brookside Gardens recently transformed a small, wooded area below the Parking Garden into a Native Azalea Garden, showcasing these fabulous plants, representing many azalea species native to the United States and adding to our diverse plant collection. Follow the winding trail across a dry stream bed while enjoying the local ecotype native perennials that were propagated and grown by Montgomery Parks' Pope Farm Nursery. This small, but exciting project provides a wonderful new garden feature and was made possible by a generous donation from the Friends of Brookside Gardens.

Bog Garden

Carnivorous plants like pitcher plants (*Sarracenia* spp.), sundews (*Drosera* spp.), and of course, Venus flytraps (*Dionaea muscipula*) are some of the most interesting members of the plant kingdom. They all need very wet, acidic, low nitrogen conditions, so growing them requires either a natural or constructed bog. When we looked for a location to construct our bog here at Brookside Gardens, a few areas seemed promising. We eventually modified the sunniest low spot by excavating an additional 3 feet then added a liner to hold water.

Bog plants evolved in these low nutrient environments and cannot tolerate the dissolved minerals in tap water. For our bog, we use rainwater from our cistern. Originally, our constructed bog was connected to a valve and drain line to control the cycling of water through the system. Recurring technical issues made us revert to a simpler design that so far has required less observation and maintenance.


we are also experimenting with cultivating a few bog orchids (e.g., *Cypripedium acaule*, *Galearis spectabilis*, *Habenaria repens*, *Platanthera ciliaris*)

To learn more about bogs, please visit **Suitland Bog** here in Maryland, **Dolly Sods Wilderness** in West Virginia or **The Joseph Pines Preserve** in southern Virginia. These organizations are engaged in an ongoing effort to preserve these important, natural wetland areas.

Idea Garden

This year we've added a fun, educational component to our Idea Garden (previously known as the Trial Garden). Each of the six display beds are designated to focus on one plant family: Euphorbiaceae, Asteracea, Amaranthacea, Solanaceae, Lamiaceae and Malvaceae. They exhibit the variation within families but also highlight their similarities to help with identification. Enjoy the colors and textures, then explore the botanical significance of the various flower shapes.

Access and Information as a Form of Accessibility

Being a part of Brookside Gardens' year-long fellowship on accessibility, as the Community Outreach Fellow, has given me the unique opportunity to think of various initiatives, practices, and tools that could be helpful for individuals with disabilities. By attending outside organizations' inclusive programming events, meeting with their Accessibility Offices, and working with Program Access (a section of Montgomery Parks that ensures inclusivity at Parks' events and physical spaces), I've learned a lot about access and inclusion.

Addressing concerns related to accessibility can seem insurmountable, but a common piece of advice I received on multiple occasions from different Accessibility Coordinators, and even my supervisor, Kevin Stewart, the Volunteer Program Manager, is to address smaller more unconventional issues with accessibility first. This advice led to the idea of creating a separate page for accessibility on Brookside Gardens' website (MoCoParks.org/BG-Accessibility).

The page is organized in two sections. The first part provides information on Brookside Garden's physical environment, such as the availability and location of accessible parking, restrooms, and entrances. The second part focuses on the adaptive equipment (EnChroma Color Blind Sunglasses, wheelchairs, and binoculars, etc.) available to borrow at the Visitor Center.

Creation of the accessibility page was a collective effort; I received very helpful feedback from staff, such as Kevin; Elissa Totin, Assistant Director of Guest Experiences; and Lisa Herman, the ADA Web Manager, who finalized the page's design and ensured it follows ADA Web standards. The accessibility page is up and functional and includes a survey; check it out and provide some much-appreciated feedback!

It can be difficult to plan a trip without access to basic information about the destination. The goal of the accessibility page is to make information readily available, allowing individuals the ability to make informed decisions and plan accordingly, especially if they have a disability, or need an accommodation.

The accessibility page is only scratching the surface; there are other accessible pre-visit planning tools, like narrative stories, introductory videos, and more that Brookside Gardens can explore in the future. Accessibility and inclusion are an on-going endeavor, and this is just the beginning!
