A Brighter Welcome at Brookside Gardens

Just inside the Brookside Gardens Visitor Center, the Gift Shop now feels a little more like the gardens themselves: lighter, calmer, and more inviting at first glance. Over the winter, Brookside Gardens partnered with the Montgomery Parks trades teams to refresh the space, creating a welcoming atmosphere that better reflects the beauty and care visitors find throughout the gardens.

Our shop remodel focused on creating a brighter, more inviting environment. Cabinets were painted in lighter tones to provide a neutral backdrop, and outdated lighting was replaced with energy-efficient LED fixtures, along with additional lighting to enhance

visibility and ambiance. These upgrades also support our sustainability goals by reducing energy consumption.

The checkout counter, once tucked behind a wall, has been repositioned to a more open and visible location. This change makes it easier for visitors to interact with staff and also allows multiple team members to assist at once, helping to streamline purchases during peak times such as the Garden of Lights, The Butterfly Experience, or any beautiful day.

Finally, we enhanced the experience by switching out a few display tables to provide a more inviting and accessible display. Together, these updates create a more welcoming Gift Shop that better serves visitors while aligning with our Strategic Plan goals to promote sustainability and belonging.

Helping the Stream, Helping Wildlife

When you enter Brookside Gardens, you will see one of the brooks that gives the Gardens its name. This stream connects to the Anacostia River, the Potomac River, and finally the Chesapeake Bay. Streams and ponds are important because they are key sources of clean water and wildlife, but they can be damaged by pollution and erosion, especially when stormwater washes in from roads and parking lots. One way to protect these areas is to plant native trees, shrubs, and groundcovers along the banks. Their roots help hold the soil in place and improve water quality.

place them into the soil along the bank. These cuttings grow roots and help keep the soil from washing away. Willow is especially useful because it grows quickly and supports many insects, including butterflies, moths, and native bees. Other native plants, such as red osier dogwood and elderberry can also be used in this way.

You may also notice pickerelweed growing along the pond edges in summer. Its blue-purple flowers and rounded leaves add beauty to the landscape. We planted more of it because its thick roots help hold sediment in place and reduce erosion. Pickerelweed also helps filter pollutants from the water and provides habitat for fish, butterflies, and bees.

At Brookside, we are planting the edges of the Aquatic Gardens to act more like natural wetlands, and use native plants because they are well suited to this area. Many of them can handle wet soil, changing weather, and shady conditions. Their deep roots help stop erosion during heavy rain and improve water quality and create shelter and food for many kinds of wildlife.

Streambanks are living systems that do important work. They protect water, support wildlife, and help keep the landscape strong. As you explore the Aquatic Gardens, look for other ways we are protecting these banks, including natural materials and careful planting.

Over the past two years, we have used a method called live staking to help stabilize the streambank. In late winter and early spring, we cut stems from native black willow and

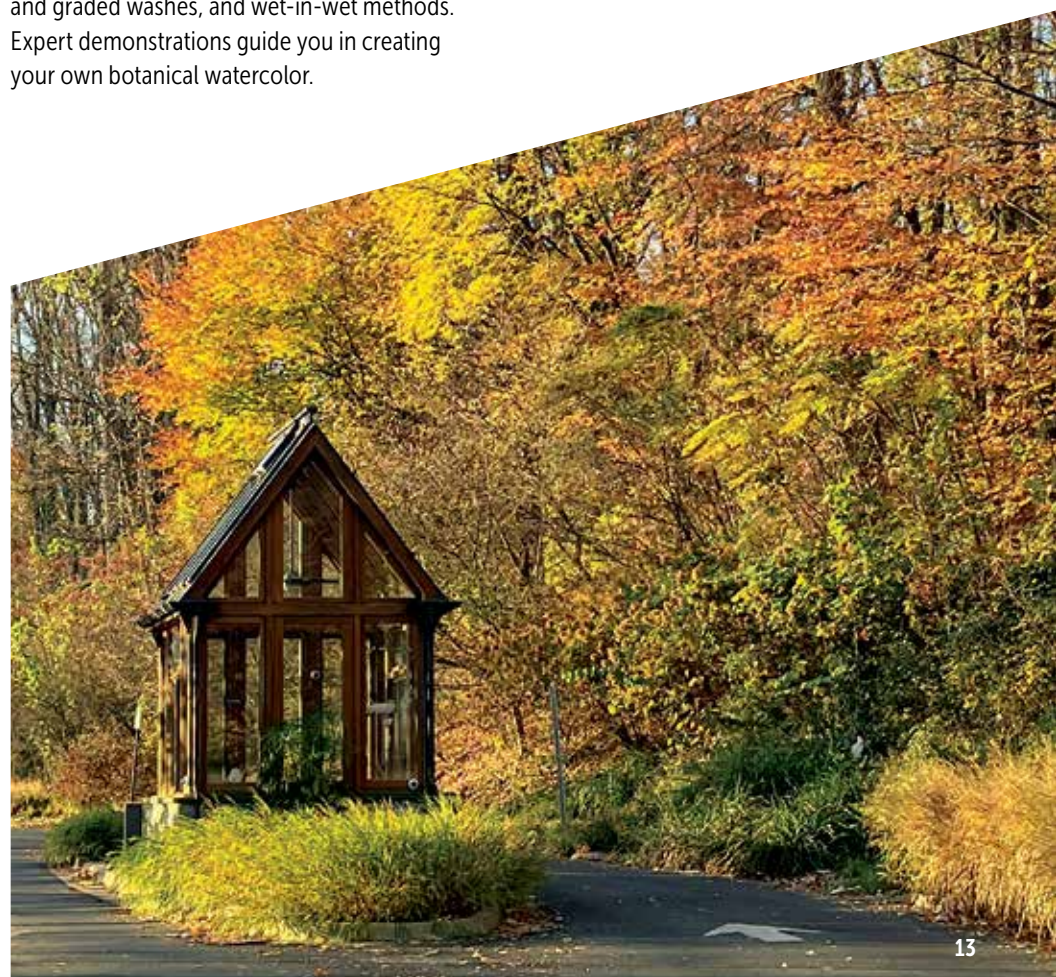

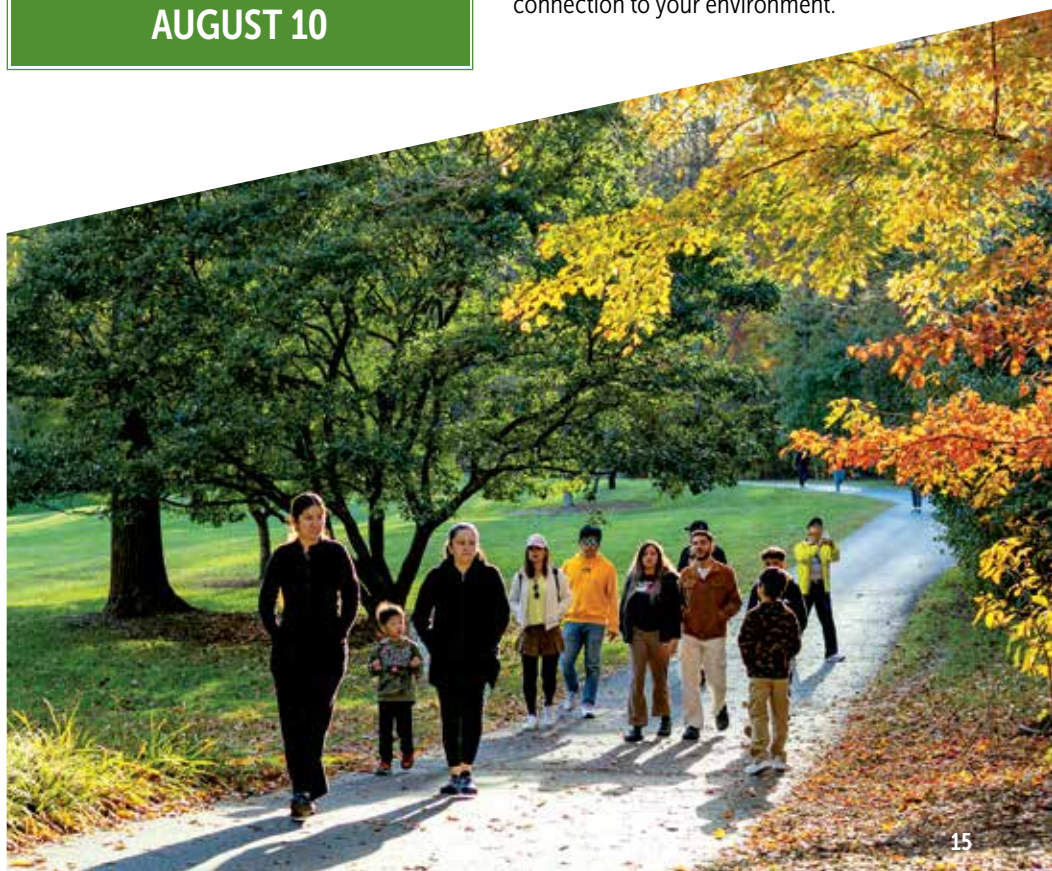
